MOOO RECIPES

Fill your deviled egg platter with juicy strawberries! This yummy dessert recipe combines fresh berries with a creamy, no-bake cheesecake filling, and tops it off with graham cracker crumbs.

Cheesecake Deviled Strawberries

18-24 large strawberries 1 c. Longmont Dairy whipping cream 1 tsp. vanilla extract 8 oz. Philadelphia cream cheese

1/3 c. Daisy sour cream

2/₃ c. white granulated sugar 1 tbsp. fresh lemon juice (optional) ½ c. graham cracker crumbs

Remove stems and cut strawberries in half. Remove a small slice from the back of each to stabalize. With a melon baller, carefully remove a small amount from the center of each strawberry to contain the filling.

Beat whipping cream until stiff peaks form (about 5 minutes).

In a separate bowl, mix the softened cream cheese, sour cream, sugar, vanilla extract, and lemon juice with an electric mixer until smooth.

Fold the whipped cream into the cream cheese mixture until well incorporated.

Use a piping bag with a star tip to fill strawberries with cream cheese mixture.

Finish each with a sprinkle of graham cracker crumbs.

Serve and enjoy!
