The U.S. tradition of sending Valentine's cards began with Esther Howland in 1847, a Massachusetts woman who began producing hand-made Valentine cards. This February, give your Valentine something different and bake Longmont Dairy's new Chocolate Sweetie Pie recipe to share with your special someone!

#### Chocolate Sweetie Pie

A milk pie or "milk flitche" as it is often called, is a traditional dessert of the Pennsylvania Dutch. We have put a new twist on this old recipe, by using Longmont Dairy Chocolate Milk.

1 unbaked pie shell
¼ cup sugar
¼ cup brown sugar
2 ½ Tbsp. all-purpose flour
½ cup Longmont Dairy Whipping Cream
1 cup Longmont Dairy Chocolate Milk
1 pinch of salt

In a mixing bowl, combine sugars, flour and salt. Add the cream and mix well. Pour into the crust. Finish filling the crust with milk. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes, or until crust is golden brown. Makes one 9 inch pie. Optional: substitute with Longmont Dairy Strawberry Milk and top with halved strawberries.
